Rocklin, CA - April 1, 2015 - Woodcreek High School is excited to announce they will once again be hosting the [Northern California High School Swimming Championships](#) at the Roseville Aquatics Complex on April 10-11. This is a Trial/Finals swim meet that will provide the swimmers the opportunity to experience great competition at the high school level. This meet qualifies as a [USA Swimming](#) Observed Event which means competitors can request to have their times submitted to the USA Swimming Database. It also promises to provide high

school swimmers with outstanding competition amongst Northern California teams in a fast pool at a state-of-the-art facility, the Roseville Aquatics Complex, where everywhere is eager to see who comes out on top.
