

curling competition in California; we have curlers come from all parts of the state and throughout the U.S. as well as international curlers from places like Canada and Scotland," elaborates Montero. "It attracts curlers of every skill level, from Olympians to new curlers alike."

## **Senior Softball Western National Championships**

**Placer Valley Heats Up August 2-7** 



Senior Softball is heating up Placer Valley August 2-7 when the 16th Annual Western National Championships swings into Foskett Regional Park in Lincoln and Maidu Regional Park in Roseville. Placer Valley Tourism (PVT) and Senior Softball-USA (SSUSA) are thrilled to be teaming up again to bring this week-long event to our region.

"SSUSA is excited to return to Placer County for the Western Nationals as this is one of the premier events in the sport," stated Fran Dowell, SSUSA Executive Director. "We deeply appreciate our partners in this signature event -Placer Valley Tourism."

The tournament will be utilizing a five game minimum format with a round robin style into a double elimination for the 11 different divisions participating. There will be 113 teams from California, Nevada, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Colorado, Texas and even British Columbia, Canada competing, all hoping to earn a coveted spot at the World Masters Championship in Las Vegas on Sept. 16 through Oct. 2.

Although several states will be represented at this Western Nationals it has a long history for the battle between Northern California and Southern California

to see which region can claim victory as the state champion explained Dowell.

Don't let the senior in senior softball fool you, these athletes come to play and play hard. The competition will be fierce and fun to watch! Foskett Regional Park is located at 1911 Finney Way in Lincoln and Maidu Regional Park is located at 1550 Maidu Drive in Roseville.






**Midyear Review** 

Placer Valley hotels have had a record breaking 6 months, outpacing all comparable Sacramento area markets. The year-to-date occupancy rate at the close of June was a staggering 74.2%; the last time Placer Valley hotels reached the 70% occupancy rate was back in 2006. Average Daily Rate (ADR) is at \$102.33, almost \$2 more than the previous record high. RevPAR (revenue per available room) came in at \$75.92, almost \$6 higher than this time last year.



While the first 6 months has shown Placer Valley hotels in a healthy economic state based on Occupancy Rate, ADR, and RevPAR (key indicators in the hotel industry) it is also important to note they are outperforming similar Sacramento Area markets.



PVT's continued focus on the shoulder months is starting to gain traction, as January and February saw a 29% increase in PVT related events generating 1,389 room nights.

As we look ahead to the remainder of 2016 our strategy to target the slower months of November and December by continue to grow our wrestling and football events as well as introducing new tournaments for pickleball and futsal will undoubtedly secure success for the second half of the year.
